### HEALTHY WEEK

Healthy Week is 28th January to 1st February. During this week, we have a range of activities planned including visits from the Chatteris Tang Soo Do Club, Chatteris Cycling Club, Chatteris Tennis Club, Ely Rugby Club, Everyone Health and Doddington Scouts. We shall also be participating in Clubbercise sessions. Healthy Week activities count towards our Games Week as part of our quest to achieve the Silver Games Mark once again.

If there are any parents who are involved in a sport, or have coaching qualifications, and would like to lead taster sessions during Healthy Week, please contact Mrs Clarke in the School Office. Sports coaches, provided by the Witchford Sports Partnership, will be teaching multi-skills sessions to our Year 1 children this term whilst our Year 4 pupils will develop striking and fielding skills.

Molly Dancing will be taking place with Year 5 on Wednesday afternoons. This will be led by Gordon Philips, from the Ouse Washes Molly Dancers, who will teach specific dances and recount stories of the local area. Swimming sessions also continue this term, with Years 5 and 6 before half-term and Years 3 and 4 after half-term.

### SCIENCE WEEK

Science Week is 11th to 15th March. Once again, a range of visitors will be in school including Jules the Wildlife Man, Mad Science, the Raptor Centre and Lion Learners. Some classes will be visiting a local secondary school where they will participate in various science lessons. As in previous years, each class will be experiencing a range of exciting experiments and activities. ## COMMUNITY BIDS

### RAISONMOOR ENVIRONMENT FUND

We are delighted to report that we have been successful in securing additional funds to enable us to develop specific learning areas within the school grounds to benefit all of our pupils. The **Ransonmoor Fund Committee** has awarded £5,000 towards the purchase of two outdoor learning pods which will be sited at the rear of the playground. These pods will be used in a variety of ways and will enable our children to carry out scientific experiments outdoors including the setting up of equipment to collect and measure rain water, learn about the water cycle and plan and create miniature gardens. These wooden structures will also provide shade and shelter. Majestic Heritage will be completing the works during the half-term break.

### TESCO BLUE TOKEN SCHEME

Thank you for all your support in donating to the **Tesco Blue Token Scheme**. We were hoping to collect the most tokens and be awarded £4,000 as our plan was to erect a wooden Reading Pod in which groups of children could read during breaks and lunchtimes and where adults could work with groups during lessons and run activities. However, we are still pleased to have been chosen for this scheme and awarded £1,000 for coming third. This will enable us to purchase additional equipment, such as books, posters and comfortable seating, for the Environmental Learning Pods on the playground.

### FENLAND AND EAST CAMBRIDGESHIRE EVIDENCE BASED FUND

We have secured a bid of £15,500 from the **Fenland and East Cambridgeshire Evidence Based Fund** to purchase and expand the range of reading scheme books, Accelerated Reading books and Story Sacks for our Early Years and to provide a programme of professional development for all our staff. We continue to value our strong partnership with parents and have continued with our Reading and Speaking and Listening workshops for parents of our children in Pre-School and our Reception Class. Other events planned for the year include visits from The Phonic Fairy (StoryTime Phonic creator Michele Larbey) to work with pupils and parents. We will also be hosting Reading Cafés where you will be invited to join us in a range of reading related activities with your child. Further information will follow.

### BURNTHOUSE FARM WIND FARM COMMUNITY BENEFIT

We have also secured a grant of £3,000 from **Burnthouse Farm Wind Farm Community Benefit** to regenerate our Science Garden. The pond will be excavated and replaced with a natural, self-sustaining pond with a non-slip platform which may be used in all weathers. There will be bug hotels and natural wildflower areas to attract wildlife, planting areas and a designated teaching area. These works are also scheduled for the half-term break and will be completed by Brad White and DBM Landscapes Ltd.

These bids have secured funding for these exciting projects which will improve the learning environments for all of our children and we are grateful to all involved as, otherwise, we would not have the means for them to evolve. The **Lionel Walden School Association** have agreed to fund the purchase of additional resources to complete these projects and 'put the icing on the cake!' Thank you to all our parents/carers, grandparents, other family members and friends for coming along and supporting LWSA events. The Lionel Walden School Association, our parent fundraising body, have many exciting events planned for this term - further details will be circulated and also posted on our website. We value the hard work and commitment of the LWSA and value your support at these events.

## PARKING OUTSIDE SCHOOL

In addition, please park with consideration for our neighbours, particularly along Child's Lane and Wood Street.

Further details will follow after half-term.



## ATTENDANCE/TERM TIME HOLIDAYS

Following meetings of the Education Welfare Officer and Headteachers of local primary schools, we are reminding parents of the need to ensure their children attend school regularly and punctually. When a child's attendance falls below 95%, the school will notify parents unless there is a valid reason. Sometimes a child may suffer illness more frequently than normal or develop a recurring illness. If this is the case, please inform us of the details so that we can provide support. The School Office should be contacted as early as possible when a child is ill and on each subsequent day thereafter.

Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Family holidays do not fall into the category of 'exceptional circumstances'. All children need to be present in school consistently to achieve their full potential.

## CHARITY

## P.E. LESSONS

Please could you ensure that your child has a separate pair of shoes in school for P.E. and games lessons and warm clothing for when the weather is colder. All items must be labelled clearly with your child's name.

No jewellery should be worn in school except for small stud earrings. These must be removed on the days of PE and swimming.

## SCHOOL UNIFORM

We would greatly appreciate everyone adhering to the recommended school uniform. The school uniform consists of navy or grey skirt, or pinafore dress, or grey or black trousers with a white shirt with a navy sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan. No 'hoodies', please. Black shoes are preferred - sports shoes should be worn for outdoor PE/games. PE kit should consist of a plain white t-shirt with navy or white shorts. PLEASE ENSURE YOUR CHILD'S CLOTHING IS LABELLED CLEARLY WITH THEIR NAME. Jewellery should not be worn, except for small, stud earrings, if essential, for pierced ears. Please note that no earrings are to be worn for any PE or swimming lesson - children must be able to remove them themselves prior to the lesson or have them removed at home on days when PE is timetabled. Nail varnish and false nails should not be worn. Mrs Clarke, in the School Office, has sweatshirts and coats, with the school logo, for sale which are hard-wearing and reasonably priced.

### **SWIMMING**
