## PRIORITIES FOR 2013-2014

Our two main priorities for 2013-2014 are Next Steps Marking and P.E.

### Marking

We shall be focusing on further developing our marking. This will include teachers training the children in how to respond to their comments and how to use them to improve their work in the future.

### P.E.

Each school has been given an additional sum of money to spend on P.E. We aim to develop P.E. by using this funding in the following ways. Part of the Sport Funding has been used to subscribe to the Witchford Sport Partnership. This gives us access to sport coaches who will come into school during the year to teach dedicated P.E. lessons. We are currently in the process of organising tennis lessons for Year 6. The 'Bikeability' programme for Year 6 in the Summer Term is also part of this partnership. We have engaged the services of Ruth Russell, a Schools Sports Coordinator, to support us in providing coaching for children and staff, over the year, in a variety of sports. We will be auditing our equipment, updating and renewing, as needed. We also are investigating incorporating taster sessions of different sports during our annual 'Healthy Week' in the Spring Term. After School Clubs, covering various sports, are available and we will ensure staff are available to provide inclusion for children of all abilities.

As well as our two main priorities, we will be working on the New National Curriculum which comes into effect on 1st September, 2014.

### SCHOOL UNIFORM

The wearing of school uniform is strongly encouraged at Lionel Walden. The school colours are navy/grey skirts/pinafore dresses, grey/black trousers with white shirts. Jewellery should not be worn, except for small stud earrings for pierced ears.

P.E. kit should consist of a plain white t-shirt with navy or white shorts and plimsolls. Strappy, colourful tops are not suitable.

### TERM TIME HOLIDAYS

Changes to the law, which came into force on 1st September, 2013, mean that schools no longer have the discretion to grant 10 days of authorised leave/absence to pupils each year. The new rules state that Headteachers "may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances". Family holidays do not fall into the category of 'exceptional circumstances'.

### COME AND HAVE LUNCH WITH YOUR CHILD!

We are having a Parent/Child 'School Meal Week' after Half Term when you can join your child for lunch. Adult meals are £2.50 each. A letter giving more information about this will be circulated shortly.



### ADMINISTERING OF MEDICINES IN SCHOOL

You are reminded that in the event of your child needing medicines in school time, a consent form MUST be completed by you before any medication can be administered by school staff. Forms can be obtained from the school office.

## Parents' Evening

This term's Parents' Evening is aimed at giving you a brief overview of how your child has settled back into school. Children's books will be located outside the classroom, in named batches, for parents to look through prior to seeing their child's class teacher. These books should be brought into the classroom and returned to the teacher during the consultation. Children should not attend this evening which will take place on Wednesday, 23rd October between 3.30 p.m. and 5.00 p.m. and between 5.30 p.m. and 7.30 p.m. Included in the books for parents to view will be your child's 'Writing Progress' book. The work in this book will be built on throughout your child's time in school demonstrating progress made each term. This work is completed independently and is left unmarked.

## End of Key Stage Results 2013

At the end of Key Stage 1 the percentages of pupils' attainment were as follows:-

The end of Key Stage 2 percentages were:-

Maths	91%	47%

Level 2 and Level 4 are the expected levels of attainment for pupils at the end of Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 respectively.

The school will be holding a Book Fair from Tuesday, 8th October to Friday, 11th October.


### UNIFORM

## Reception Children

In preparation for full time attendance, Reception aged children are staying at school for lunch until 1.00 p.m. from the week commencing 9th September. Initially, the children who stay, eat in the hall and are helped by children in Year 6. The cost of a school meal is £2.00 and should be paid for in advance. Weekly menus are circulated to parents and are displayed in school. Further information on school meals can be found in the paragraph below entitled 'Dinner Money'. Details about attendance should have already been circulated. Reception children can attend full time from Monday, 23rd September.



## Dinner Money

We are pleased that we have been able to avoid an increase in the cost of school meals. The cost of a school dinner remains at £2.00 per meal (£10.00 per week). All dinners should be paid for in advance or on the day. Please send the money with children to school in a named envelope. Any dinners paid for but not taken due to absence will be refunded or carried forward. Cheques should be made payable to 'Lionel Walden School'. Please look out for special promotional days .
