### HEALTHY WEEK

Healthy Week is scheduled for the week commencing 3rd February. During this week, we have a range of activities planned including visits from the Chatteris Cycling Club, Chatteris Tennis Club, Chatteris Town Football Club, Chatteris Cricket Club, Everyone Health, FE Fitness and Doddington Scouts. We shall also be participating in Jujitsu, Zumba and Clubbercise sessions. Our Sports Crew, pupils in Years 5 and 6, will be organising intra-class sports competitions at lunchtimes. Healthy Week activities count towards our Games Week as part of our quest to achieve the Silver Games Mark once again.

If there are any parents who are involved in a sport, or have coaching qualifications, and would like to lead taster sessions during Healthy Week, please contact Mrs Clarke in the School Office. Sports coaches, provided by the Witchford Sports Partnership, will be teaching 'street dance' sessions to our children in Year 2 and Year 4 this term. A coach from All4Sports will be teaching throwing and catching skills with children in Year 2 and Year 3, in addition to leading a range of lunchtime activities including hockey, basketball, football and Funky Fitness. All4Sports will be running two after-school clubs this term - gymnastics on Mondays for children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 and table tennis on Thursdays for all year groups.

We encourage all pupils (and adults) to take part in the Daily Mile. This takes place on the playground (or on the field when the weather permits) between 8.30am and 8.45am. Everyone attempts to complete as many laps as possible and to start the day in a positive and healthy way. Do come and join us! Molly Dancing will be taking place again this year with Year 5 on Wednesday afternoons. This will be led by Gordon Philips, from the Ouse Washes Molly Dancers, who will teach specific dances and recount stories of the local area. Swimming sessions also continue this term, with Years 5 and 6 before half-term and Years 3 and 4 after half-term.

## SCIENCE WEEK

Science Week is scheduled for the week commencing 9th March. Once again, a range of visitors will be in school including Jules the Wildlife Man, the Mad Science team, the Raptor Centre and Lion Learners. Our Year 5 pupils will be visiting a local secondary school where they will participate in various science lessons. As in previous years, each class will be experiencing a range of exciting experiments and activities. Parental help is always appreciated during this busy week - please contact Mrs Clarke in the School Office for further information. We hope you are looking forward to participating in this year's 'Homework Challenge' - further details will follow!

## POWERFUL WORDS PROJECT

In each class, we are continuing to focus on the development of vocabulary. Children are encouraged to use ambitious language in their speech and in their writing across all subjects. Mathematical and scientific vocabulary is included. All classrooms have a display showcasing a 'Word of the Week' - these are added to as the term progresses. To further develop this knowledge and acquisition, we are taking part in the Powerful Words project. This involves using a range of 'Mrs Wordsmith' resources (dictionaries, images and word games) to accelerate pupils' progress. These resources will be used to explore meanings in context, look at synonyms (different words which have a similar meaning), antonyms (different words with opposite meanings), etymology (the origins of words) and word collocations (two words which are often used together, for example, strong tea, deep sleep). The aim is to teach our pupils one hundred and twenty words each term. Pupils will also continue to have a 'class reader' book to extend vocabulary and understanding and to promote enjoyment of books and reading through listening to adults reading with expression.

## POWER MATHS

The Mathematics curriculum places a high focus on pupils being able to problem solve and explain and justify their answers to mathematical questions. After carrying out research, we made the decision to purchase the Power Maths scheme to supplement our teaching of Mathematics. Teachers use the resources alongside a range of other resources. This has provided greater opportunities for pupils to develop their understanding and to increase their confidence when faced with more challenging problems. Children will be required to work independently for some of the time as well as in pairs and small groups. The feedback from both adults and children has been extremely positive and the impact of Power Maths is clearly evident. The pupils made the following comments:-

"I like Power Maths. It makes Maths even more fun."

"Power Maths is really good. I like the way it's set out - you get more work completed."

"I really enjoy Maths. It's challenging and you learn something new every day!"

## ENTERING/EXITING SCHOOL

Parents are requested **not** to park vehicles on the yellow zig zag lines or pavements outside school. This applies before and after school and when collecting children at other times. In addition, please park with consideration for our neighbours, particularly along Child's Lane and Wood Street.

Parents and children should enter the school premises through the pedestrian access (smaller gate) and **not** through the car park, which is for staff only. Please also approach the Lions' Den/annexe along the pedestrian access route only.

Also, for safety reasons, we ask that scooters and bicycles are not ridden on school premises; please ensure that your children are aware of this.

## ATTENDANCE/TERM TIME HOLIDAYS

Following meetings of the Local Authority Attendance Officer and Headteachers of local primary schools, we are reminding parents of the need to ensure their children attend school regularly and punctually. When a child's attendance falls below 95%, the school will notify parents unless there is a valid reason. Sometimes a child may suffer illness more frequently than normal or develop a recurring illness. If this is the case, please inform us of the details so that we can provide support. The School Office should be contacted as early as possible when a child is ill and on each subsequent day thereafter.

Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Family holidays do not fall into the category of 'exceptional circumstances'. All children need to be present in school consistently to achieve their full potential.

A separate letter is being issued relating to Unauthorised Absence and the issuing of Penalty Notices. Please also refer to the Attendance section, under the Information tab, on the school's website.

### CHARITY

The Carol Service held at St. Mary's Parish Church in December raised £167.

This money has been donated to Shelter to support those facing homelessness, at the request of the pupils.

### P.E. LESSONS

Please could you ensure that your child has a separate pair of shoes in school for PE and games lessons and warm clothing for when the weather is colder. All items must be labelled clearly with your child's name.

No jewellery should be worn in school except for small stud earrings. These must be removed on the days of PE and swimming.

## SCHOOL UNIFORM

We would greatly appreciate everyone adhering to the recommended school uniform. The school uniform consists of navy or grey skirt, or pinafore dress, or grey or black trousers with a white shirt and a navy sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan. No 'hoodies', please. Black shoes are preferred - sports shoes should be worn for outdoor PE/games. PE kit should consist of a plain white t-shirt with navy or white shorts.

**PLEASE ENSURE YOUR CHILD'S CLOTHING IS LABELLED CLEARLY WITH THEIR NAME - any misplaced items can then be returned to the owner.**

Jewellery should not be worn, except for small, stud earrings, if essential, for pierced ears. Please note that no earrings are to be worn for any PE or swimming lesson - children must be able to remove them themselves prior to the lesson or have them removed at home on days when PE is timetabled. Nail varnish and false nails should not be worn. Mrs Clarke, in the School Office, has sweatshirts and coats, with the school logo, for sale which are hard-wearing and reasonably priced.

### **SWIMMING**

Swimming dates for this term are as follows:-

#### **YEARS 5 AND 6**

Fridays: 10th, 17th, 24th and 31st January; 7th and 14th February

#### **YEARS 3 AND 4**

Fridays: 28th February; 6th, 13th, 20th and 27th March

The cost of swimming is £2.50 per session. Please note that it is compulsory for all children to wear swimming hats. These are available from the School Office at a cost of 75p each. Earrings must be removed by the pupil prior to the start of the lesson or should be removed and left at home if the pupil is unable to do this.
